

Juanita Bay Pump Station Replacement Project ONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Increased activity at the Juanita Bay Pump Station work site after May 14 as crews install air ducts

During the week of May 14, King County crews will begin installing air ducts at the new Juanita Bay Pump Station. The work should be completed by the end of May.

To install the air ducts, crews must insert steel piles nearly 30 feet below grade to allow for excavation. and cut through the pump station foundation. Both activities will increase vibration and noise coming from the site. King County's contractor is closely monitoring vibration levels to minimize disruption and protect against property damage.

After installing the air ducts, crews will continue work on the below grade pump station structure at the corner of Northeast Juanita Drive and 93rd Avenue Northeast.


King County is building the new wastewater pump station to help ensure your community receives safe, reliable wastewater service for the next 50 years.
