King Street Odor Control Project Update - June 4, 2008

Work in South King Street in the vicinity of King Street Station begins today, Wednesday, June 4. King County's contractor will cut concrete and begin locating utilities along the vent pipe path from 6 p.m. until approximately midnight. The contractor will have traffic control signs and personnel in place to ease congestion around the work site to (see diagram on reverse).

Access to King Street Center, King Street Station and parking spots along the westbound lane of South King Street will be maintained throughout today's work.

To reduce the potential for late night disruptions to neighbors, the start time for the project's night work was shifted from 10 p.m. to 6 p.m. This decision was made in consultation with City of Seattle staff and the most directly affected community members.

What to Expect

- Increased noise and construction activity in South King Street between 6 p.m. and midnight on June 4
- Reduced access along South King Street east of Second Avenue South
- No access to Second Avenue South from the westbound lanes South King Street

King County is committed to being a good neighbor during construction. The project team will work with community members to minimize disruptions to the daily lives of those living and working near the project site.
