King Street Odor Control Project Update - September 16, 2008


Night work begins Thursday, Sept. 18; foul air line installation along South King Street begins the week of Sept. 22.

King County's contractor finished stabilizing the foundation of the odor control facility today and will begin working along the northern border of South King Street to install the foul air duct connecting the county's sewer pipe to the odor

control facility.

Crews will make preparations along the pipe corridor through the parking spots between King Street Center and South King Street after 6 p.m. on Wednesday, September 18.

The foul air duct installation is scheduled to begin the week of Monday, September 22



and be completed in early October. Work along South King Street will occur weekdays from 6 p.m. - 6 a.m. and in the construction zone south of King Street Station from 7 a.m. - 5 p.m.

What to expect

- Crews and construction equipment working along the northern border of South King Street east of Second Avenue South at night.
- King County's contractor will maintain access to King Street Center and King Street Station at all times.
- Carpool parking spots between King Street Center and South King Street will remain available from 6 a.m. - 6 p.m.

- The sidewalk south of King Street Center between King Street Station and Second Avenue South will remain open at all times. Construction fencing will line the sidewalk between King Street Center and South King Street during work hours.
- Westbound traffic east of Second Avenue will continue using the northern lane of South King Street. Traffic control personnel will be on site during work hours to ease congestion around the work area.
- There is a possibility of brief delays entering and exiting King Street Center and King Street Station on the few nights when crews are working directly in front of the primary access ways to each building.

King County is committed to being a good neighbor during construction. The project team will continue to work with community members to minimize disruptions to the daily lives of those living and working near the construction zone.
