About the Murray CSO Control Project

King County is building the Murray facility to keep polluted water out of the Puget Sound.

During big storms, King County's sewer pipes can fill up. When this happens, sewage and stormwater must be released directly into the Puget Sound. The Murray tank will store the sewage and water until it can be cleaned at the treatment plant in Magnolia.



Crews are now conducting mechanical and electrical work inside the facility and have started to backfill soil behind the building.
