

5-foot-wide sewer line installation complete! Connection to underground tank and local sewer line to begin this month

King County's contractor for the Murray CSO Control Project has finished installing the five-foot-wide sewer line under Beach Dr. S.W. Starting as early as Saturday, July 23, the contractor will begin installing the connection pipe between the new five-foot-wide pipe, the underground storage tank, and the local sewer service line. This work will take approximately one month to complete.

Anticipated Impacts

A section of the local sewer service line needs to be replaced to ensure reliable service in the future. The contractor will install a temporary bypass system to maintain sewer service for the neighborhood while the connection is underway. The temporary system will require a pump to run continuously for approximately five days (day and night) to move flows around the work zone. A representative from the contractor will be on site at all times to monitor the pump.



Installation of the sewer connection pipe will take approximately one month.

The contractor needs to install shoring to hold back water and soil during installation of the connection pipe. **Intermittent, increased noise and vibration can be expected.** Noise and vibration will continue to be monitored.

Increased odors may be expected when the temporary bypass system is being set up. Air quality will be monitored at all times during setup to ensure safe conditions. No additional roadway impacts are anticipated as a result of this work.

What to expect:

- Work to occur on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. and on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- Periods of increased noise, vibration, and odors
- Noise may be more noticeable at night due to pumps required for sewer bypass
- Regular project work to continue on the project site and in Lowman Beach Park
- No additional roadway impacts as a result of this work
