

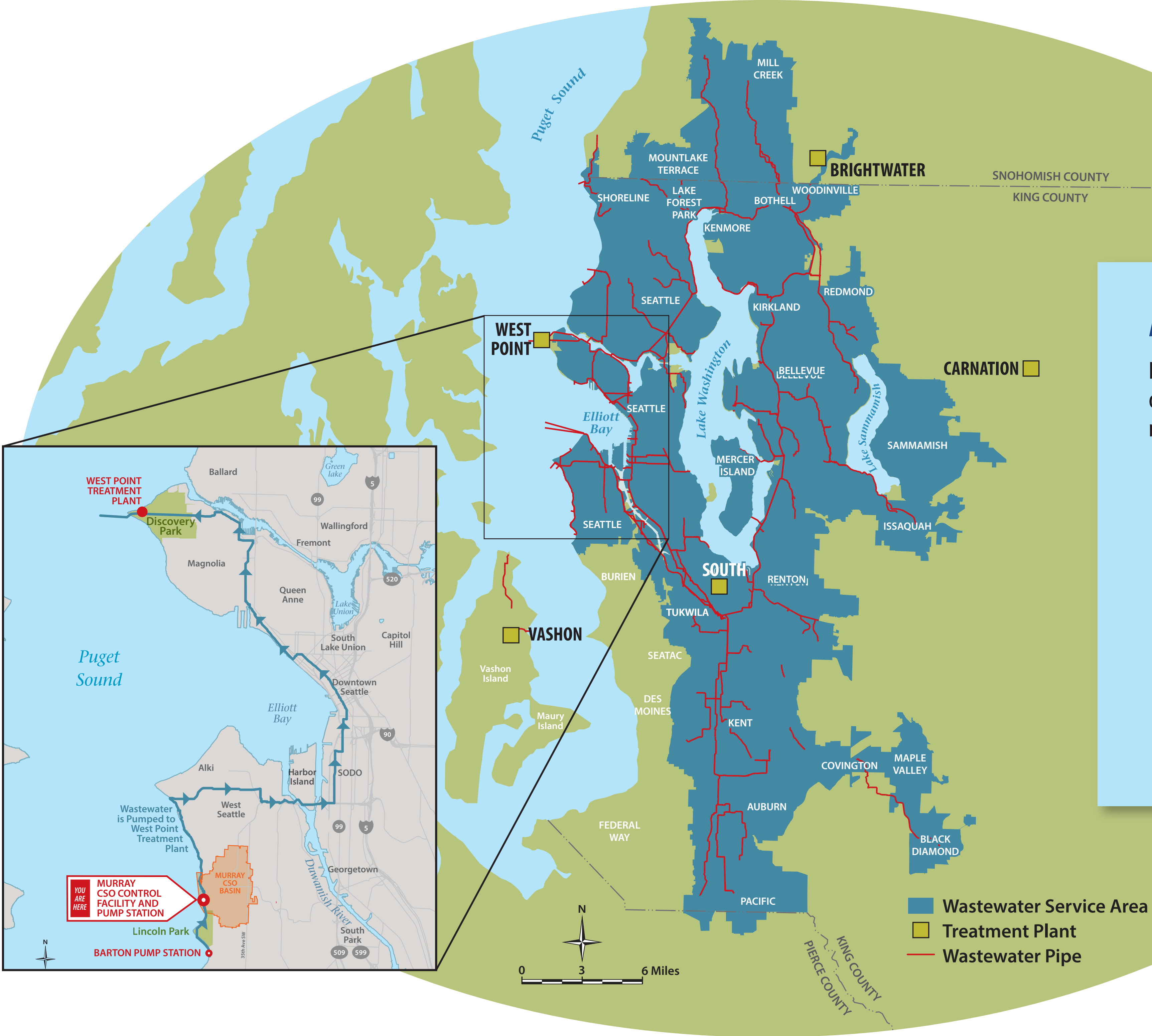
Protecting waters across the region

King County serves over 1.7 million people in the Puget Sound region by

providing high quality and effective treatment to wastewater collected from our local sewer agencies. The 424-square-mile service area includes most urban areas of King County and parts of south Snohomish County and northeast Pierce County.

The Murray Basin

includes 992 acres of land in West Seattle. Wastewater and stormwater within this area and the Barton Basin flow to the Murray Pump Station and go to the West Point Treatment Plant in Magnolia for treatment. The Murray Wet Weather Facility is an important part of the County's regional conveyance and treatment system.
