## Magnolia CSO permit hearing scheduled for July 8

July 8, 2014, at 9:30 a.m. in City Council Chambers

The City of Seattle Transportation Committee will review King County's application for a long-term permit on July 8, 2014, at 9:30 a.m. The Committee meets in Council Chambers at 600 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Seattle, WA 98104. Interested people will have the opportunity to provide comment at this meeting.

This permit is a type of street-user permit that the City of Seattle issues for encroachments in the right-of-way. It can be for anything from sidewalk cafes and hanging flower baskets to underground structures. In this case, King County is seeking a permit to construct a new gravity sewer pipeline on 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue West. If approved by the Council, King County will begin on construction during the rest of the permit publishing process, pushing construction a month ahead of schedule.

The new gravity sewer pipeline will stretch from 32<sup>nd</sup> Ave. W. to a new 1.5 million gallon underground storage tank near Smith Cove/Terminal 91. This facility will store peak combined sewer flows so that discharges of untreated wastewater and stormwater into Puget Sound are limited to no more than one per year on a long-term average.

Excavation for the storage tank site is underway, and preparations for construction on 32<sup>nd</sup> Ave. W. began in late June.
