Overnight sewer pipe activities on 23rdnd Avenue W for two nights between December 12-17

This week King County's contractor is continuing to work on both 23rd Avenue West and 32nd Avenue West to install a new gravity sewer pipeline. The sewer line is one part of a new combined sewer overflow (CSO) control facility in Magnolia that will reduce overflows of stormwater and sewage to Puget Sound during rain storms we are currently experiencing.

During the week of December 8, the contractor will continue final preparations for insertion of the



pipeline into the drilled borehole. While the pipe to be pulled back is currently laying along 32nd Avenue it will be pulled back through the borehole by equipment on the 23rd Avenue West site. The pipeline must be pulled through in one continuous effort that is expected to last for two days.

Pipe pullback is currently scheduled for Friday, December 12th and Saturday, December 13th, with completion of work on Sunday, December 14th. This schedule may change, and could occur later in this period, but the pullback period will

What you can expect

- Work hours Monday through Thursday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- From Friday beginning around 9:00 a.m. until Sunday morning, 24-hour work hour work is required for the pullback operation. The contractor will continue working on Sunday during regular construction hours after pullback is completed.
- Neighbors near the Smith Cove site may hear overnight activity including generators and the drill rig.
- There will be overnight lighting to ensure site safety for crews
- There will be truck traffic to convey materials that come from the borehole during pullback.
