Shoring removal begins at storage tank site

April 6, 2015

Beginning Monday, April 6th, crews will begin removing the shoring that surrounds the new underground storage tank. The contractor will pull shoring from the ground using a vibratory method. People in the area will notice noise from this activity. Sheet removal will take about a week to complete.

King County's contractor, Stellar J, is continuing to construct a new combined sewer overflow (CSO) control facility in Magnolia. A 1.5-million gallon underground tank in the Smith Cove area will store excess flows of stormwater and sewage when heavy rains fill pipes, reducing untreated overflows to Puget Sound.

- Work hours 7:00 a.m. to about 5:00 p.m. Monday - Friday.
- Expect noise in the area during this work.
