Construction activities on 32nd Avenue West

June 11 – June 18, 2015

King County's contractor, Walsh Construction, is continuing to install an underground structure on 32nd Avenue West that will transfer stormwater and wastewater flows from the existing sewer line to the new gravity sewer pipeline. The new 3,000-foot sewer line is one part of a new combined sewer overflow (CSO) control facility in Magnolia that will reduce overflows of stormwater and sewage to Puget Sound during heavy rain storms.

- Work in the middle of 32nd Avenue West is winding down as construction on the diversion structure south of the Howe Street Bridge nears completion.
- Southbound traffic continues to be detoured to the west side of 32nd Avenue West and northbound traffic to the east side of 32nd Avenue West around the work area.
- **June 15-18, Monday to Thursday, Walsh Construction will restore a waterline that was moved for construction. If this work results in a service disruption to your home, Seattle Public Utilities will provide advance notice.**
- A pump on the west side of 32nd Avenue West near the Howe Street Bridge continues to bypass sewer flows around the work site.
- In the coming weeks, both lanes of traffic will be detoured to the west side of 32nd Avenue West as final work is completed on the east side of the road. We will provide dates when they are available.



What you can expect during this work

- Work hours 7:00 a.m. to about 5:00 p.m. Monday -- Friday.

Please drive slowly in the work area and watch for signs and flaggers

- Limited construction noise and a quiet generator that is no louder than the one that has been in place throughout the project.
- The work area will be fenced at night, and detours will remain in place

Thank you to residents and visitors who have responded to requests to avoid parking along the eastern corner 32nd Avenue West and West Galer Street. The corner serves as a critical catch basin for stormwater runoff. The contractor has marked the area off as a no parking zone. The contractor has noted that damage to the erosion control buffers has stopped, and appreciates your cooperation. The presence of a fire hydrant at the corner also prohibits parking within 15 feet, per Seattle Municipal Code.
