Traffic flow changing as work continues on 32nd Avenue West

Week of June 22, 2015

King County's contractor, Walsh Construction, will be changing traffic flow on 32nd Avenue West as they wrap up work on the underground structure in the roadway and restore utilities. Looking forward, restoration of the right-of-way adjacent to the travel lanes will begin the week of June 29. The contractor will not be working Friday, July 3rd.

- Traffic will be shifted back to the previous detour route on Monday, June 22. On June 22-23, the water line will be restored to its previous location.



- The sewer bypass system is scheduled to be removed on June 25-26.

The contractor reports that residents are driving slowly through the area and watching for crews. Your safe driving is very much appreciated by our workers!

What you can expect during this work

- Work hours 7:00 a.m. to about 5:00 p.m. Monday -- Friday.
- Continue watching for flaggers in the area as traffic flow is changed, and during the work.
- The work area will be fenced at night, and the detour will remain in place.

As we continue restoration, we will maintain erosion control along the eastern corner 32nd Avenue West and West Galer Street. The corner serves as a critical catch basin for stormwater runoff. The contractor has marked the area off as a no parking zone, but continued parking in that area has resulted in damage to erosion control measures. The presence of a fire hydrant at the corner also prohibits parking within 15 feet, per Seattle Municipal Code.
