

Spring Project Update

King County's Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD) is building a new wet weather treatment station in Georgetown at the corner of Fourth Avenue South and South Michigan Street. As part of the Wet Weather Treatment Station project, WTD is also building a new outfall structure under the First Avenue South Bridge and connecting pipes from the station to the outfall. Read below for updates on all three project areas, highlights from the past month, and upcoming work

Construction in roadways starting soon

As we shared in our February Update, crews will be moving into the roadways for upcoming construction work. The work and road closure on South River Street have been pushed to a later date.

Work on East Marginal Way South and South Michigan Street begins as early as April 10. Crews will start by preparing work areas.

We will share specific information about lane, sidewalk, and/or road closures with you soon, once detours and bus stop relocations are finalized. **Crews are permitted to work on South Michigan Street and East Marginal Way South overnight, from 8 p.m. – 5 a.m.** All traffic lanes will be open during the day.



King County is committed to being a good neighbor throughout construction. We will do our best to minimize impacts to the Georgetown neighborhood and for those travelling through the project area.

What to expect during roadway construction:

- Limited turns to and from select driveways: We will work with residents and businesses in advance of driveway impacts.
- Traffic detours and lane shifts: Crews will establish traffic control as approved by the City to safely install pipes under roadways. Uniformed police officers and flaggers will be used as needed.
- Pedestrian detours: People travelling near active work areas will be rerouted for your safety and the safety of our crews.
- Bus stop relocation: We are working with King County Metro (Metro) to potentially relocate bus stops near the work site for Metro routes 131, 132, and 154. Riders will be notified of stop relocations as soon as Metro confirms where to relocate the bus stops. We will do our best to minimize impacts for riders in the Georgetown neighborhood.
- Work hours: Work on South Michigan Street and East Marginal Way South to occur overnight, from 8 p.m. – 5 a.m.
