

Construction Update

May 2019

King County's Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD) is building a new wet weather treatment station in Georgetown at the corner of Fourth Avenue South and South Michigan Street. As part of the Wet Weather Treatment Station project, WTD is also building a new outfall structure under the First Avenue South Bridge and connecting pipes from the station to the outfall. Read below for updates, highlights from the past month, and information about upcoming work.

Join us this summer at community events!

Crews continue to make progress at the treatment station site and to install the EBI Pipeline and Michigan Pipeline in roadways, (see map for reference). We appreciate your patience as crews complete work overnight from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. in the roadways. Work on East Marginal Way South and South Michigan Street will continue throughout 2019.

Beyond the project sites, King County remains committed to working with the Georgetown neighborhood. This summer, King County will be out in the community to share information about construction activities and have conversations with community members.
