

# King County to install new sewer pipe near Kent Phoenix Academy in Kent in 2013

King County protects public health and the environment by conveying and treating the region's wastewater. Wastewater is collected by local cities and sewer districts, including the cities of Auburn and Kent, and transported through King County pipes to the County's South Treatment Plant in Renton.

In order to accommodate growth in the area, King County is installing 1,800 feet of new sewer pipe adjacent to the Kent Phoenix Academy and along Southeast 264th Street between the Academy and 114th Avenue Southeast in Kent (see map).

This new pipeline, the Kent East Hill Diversion, will provide sufficient capacity to meet Kent's needs through 2050 and reduce the chance of sewer backups into homes and streets.

# What to expect during construction

- Noise and dust typical of a construction site
- Crews, trucks, and heavy equipment
- Increased truck traffic and road restrictions
- Traffic control and flaggers
- Access limitations
- Pedestrian restrictions and sidewalk closures
- Typical work hours 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. weekdays



The new sewer pipe will add capacity to the King County sewer system and reduce the chance of sewer overflows into homes and streets.
