Kent-Auburn Conveyance System Improvements Project Phase B in Pacific, Algona and Auburn

Why is King County constructing this project?

To protect public health and the environment, King County's Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD) is building improvements that will accommodate growth in the area and allow us to continue to provide safe, reliable sewer service.

The new pipelines will provide additional capacity which will help reduce the risk of sewer overflows. The new pipelines will provide enough capacity to carry wastewater from the cities of Auburn, Pacific, and Algona through 2060.

What to expect during construction

- To build the new sewer pipe, the contractor will need to work in the street (right-of-way) in some areas
- Other typical construction impacts include:
 - Noise, dust and vibrations
 - Occasional night and weekend work
 - Increased truck traffic and staging of heavy machinery and equipment
 - Loss of street parking and road closures
 - Vehicle and pedestrian detours

Project work along West Main Street in Auburn begins this spring!

Construction on a small section of the project begins this spring along West Main St. in Auburn. Crews will be building a 300-foot long portion of the new sewer line. The goal is to complete this work in advance of a future City of Auburn paving project on West Main St. This work is anticipated to last through the summer.

The larger part of the project – which includes building a new sewer line through Auburn, Algona and Pacific is expected to begin early in 2017.






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City of Auburn: a small part of the project along West Main Street started this spring—see more details on the first page. The remainder of the work will include open cut pipeline construction across commercial and industrial properties; going under State Route 18, crossing 15th Street Southwest, and next to Perimeter Rd.


City of Algona: work in Algona will include open cut construction primarily in residential areas—along 1st Ave. North, Seattle Blvd. South and the Interurban Trail. Most of the work will be in the street; some work will be adjacent to or on properties—the owners of these properties have been told about this work.

City of Pacific: work in Pacific will include open cut pipeline construction along Frontage Road and minor improvements and a stream crossing at the Pacific Pump Station on Frontage Road.
