Sewer Pipeline Work in Pacific, Algona & Auburn

Phase B of the Kent-Auburn Conveyance System Improvements Project

June 15 - Upcoming work in Algona and Pacific

Pipeline construction along greenbelt in Algona

Starting **as early as the week of June 18**, crews will begin installing a sewer pipeline in the open area just east of the Interurban Trail, working north from Trailhead Park on 1st Ave. N. in Algona.

- Preconstruction activities have already taken place including access road construction, fence removal, and installation of a dewatering system and monitoring wells
- Approved work hours: 7 am to 7 pm Mon-Friday; 9am to 6pm on Saturdays
- There will construction traffic entering and exiting 1st Ave
- Expect noise, dust and vibrations
- Adjacent residents and owners have been contacted.

Paving along Frontage Rd. in Pacific

Beginning in late-June final paving will begin along Frontage Road.

- Sections of the road and some entries will be temporarily blocked.
- We will be notifying businesses and residents along Frontage Rd. ahead of the work.
- Additional notice will be provided closer to the time of the work.

After completing paving along Frontage Road, work will continue north across Ellingson Road, and then to Seattle Blvd. in Algona. Additional notices will be provided as the work progresses.

This work is part of King County's commitment to provide safe and reliable sewer service. The new sewer pipe will provide enough capacity to transport wastewater in the project area through 2060. Construction began in 2017 and is expected to last until 2019.
