Construction Activity Update

Beginning as early as March 6th, King County's contractors will begin to install a 30 foot pipe under S. Hanford St. They will be using a technique called pipe ramming, in which compressed air is used to drive a hammer that pushes or 'rams' a pipe through the ground. The pipe will be rammed in three sections with a break after each, during which the contractor will weld the sections of pipe together. The pipe ramming of each section will take about an hour and the complete installation of the pipe should take approximately 4 days in total.

What to expect:

- Pipe ramming will begin after 9:00 AM
- Increased noise and vibration during periods of pipe ramming
- Flaggers may be present to direct traffic

For your safety:

- Please drive slowly through work areas
- Watch for flaggers
- Be aware of equipment and trucks
- Stop when needed and as directed. Be patient - flaggers will do their best to get you moving
