Reminder: W Lake Sammamish Pkwy overnight closure begins tonight; upcoming single-lane closures for restoration

Reminder: W Lake Sammamish Pkwy – overnight work

Closure and work hours: 11 p.m. on Friday, April 5 to 7 a.m. on Saturday, April 6.

Crews will close a small segment of W Lake Sammamish Pkwy near the Sunset Pump Station to accommodate the delivery of a new generator. The new generator will provide power during loss of normal power to the upgraded Sunset Pump Station and systems.

164th PI SE - single-lane closures during work hours

Closure and work hours: 6:30 a.m. to 7 p.m., weekdays and Saturdays (equipment and closure will not start until 7 a.m.)

To prepare for final paving, crews will continue to close a single lane of 164th PI SE during work hours through mid-May. Both lanes will be open to traffic outside of work hours.

What to expect:

- **Increased noise and vibrations:** Neighbors can expect noise and vibrations from construction activities, grinding, and paving.
- **Lights on W Lake Sammamish Pkwy SE:** Lights will be used to illuminate the worksite overnight.
- Flaggers and signage: Crews and signage will assist drivers in detouring around closures. Access to homes and driveways will be maintained and prioritized for the duration of closures.
- Access maintained for services: Access will be maintained for emergency services, waste pickup, and mail delivery.

The schedule and duration for construction is tentative and is subject to change as work progresses. We will continue to provide email notices with updates on timing of specific construction activities.
