



Field work for a new sewer line in Coal Creek Area continues in July

King County is planning to upgrade a regional sewer line that serves Bellevue and Newcastle. As part of this work, the project team has been doing field work to assess soil and groundwater conditions. This work will help confirm a pipeline path that will reduce impacts to the Coal Creek Natural Area.

Starting as early as July 25, the King County project team will begin drilling test holes along Coal Creek Parkway and in neighboring streets. The County's project team is currently confirming a pipeline path that will reduce impacts to the Coal Creek Natural Area. The new sewer line will provide needed capacity for a growing community and allow us to move most of the pipeline away from its existing location in Coal Creek.

Drilling will occur at several places along Coal Creek Parkway and in three neighboring streets. It will take 2-4 days for crews to drill in each location. Construction of the new sewer line is currently scheduled to begin in 2021.

Working with you during construction:

King County is committed to keeping you informed so you can **plan ahead** and **be in touch with us** with any questions or concerns you might have.

Here's what you need to know to plan ahead:

- There will be travel lane, bicycle lane and sidewalk closures near drilling locations during work hours.
- Message signs, where required, will be posted to provide notice 48 hours in advance.
- Work hours are 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.
- Neighborhood street drilling will take place during daylight hours and access to residences and driveways will be maintained. Drill rigs will remain on site until project completion.
