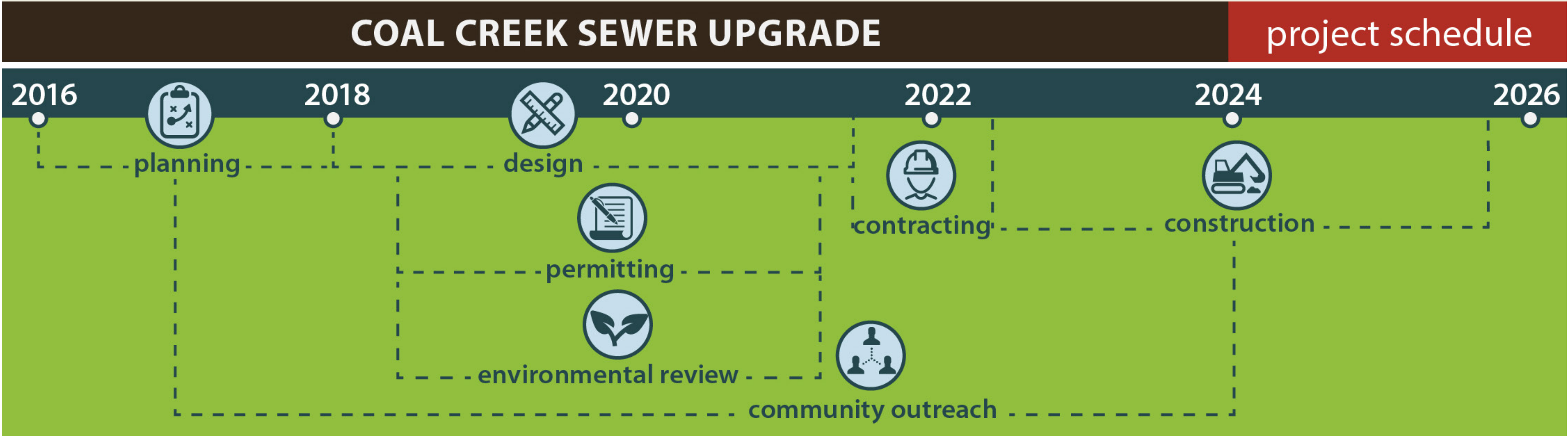


## Project Overview

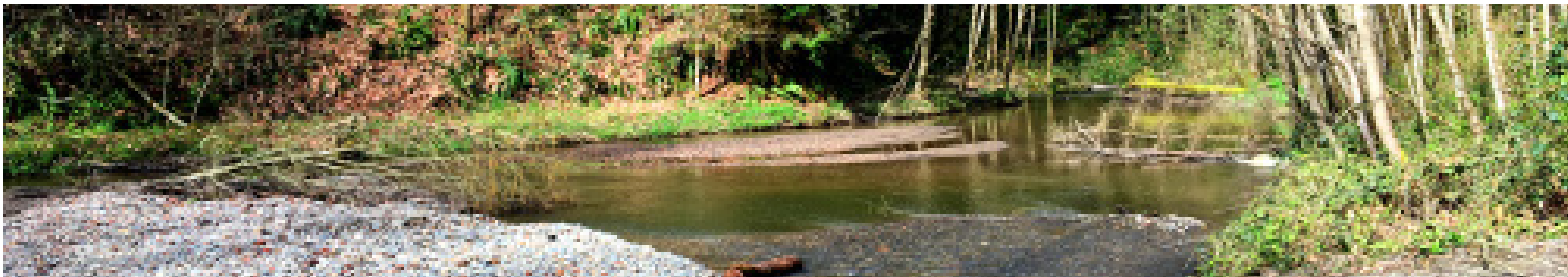
King County Wastewater Treatment Division will build a new sewer pipe to serve parts of Bellevue and Newcastle.
