## Denny Way Regulator Station Upgrade now begins this week Construction activity expected to last one year

Starting this week, the King County Wastewater Treatment Division will begin construction work at the Denny Way Regulator Station in Myrtle Edwards Park on Elliott Bay. The project will update equipment and add a sampling room to the facility. **The project, previously expected to start in September 2016, was delayed until January 2017.** 

Construction access to the site will be mainly from the south entrance of the Myrtle Edwards Park. Only concrete delivery vehicles will access the work site from the north entrance of the park. The work will

take approximately one year to complete. King County will notify the community if the schedule changes.

## What to Expect

- Work hours between 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.
   Monday through Friday. Periods of extended hours as needed pending approval from the City of Seattle.
- Temporary periods of trail narrowing.
   Flaggers will direct vehicles, pedestrians, and bicycles through the area.



**Project Updates: January 2017** 

- Noise close to the work area.
- Work and equipment will be confined to the project site, designated staging, and parking areas.
- Disturbed trails and paths will be restored.
