



Pipe lining work begins for King County's Eastgate Interceptor Project week of May 17

In order to protect the community and the environment, King County is rehabilitate sewer pipelines along a 2,400 foot-long section of the Eastgate Interceptor. The Eastgate Interceptor pipeline is a part of King County's regional wastewater system. Pipelines carry wastewater from homes and businesses to our regional treatment plants. This project will extent the useful life of this pipeline another 50 years.

Starting the week of May 17, there will be additional activities on King County's Eastgate 3 Rehabilitation Project, within the Lake Hills Greenbelt Park.

What you can expect:

- Pipe lining vehicles and equipment as the contractor begins the first pipe lining sections.
- Long hours and possible overnight work - the pipe lining needs to 'cure' (harden) which has to happen over a continuous period of time
- During the lining process you may notice odors or noise from the lining equipment and process

The lining work is expected to take 6-8 weeks to complete. Other project work continue after this, including manhole lining, site clean-up and restoration.
