



## **Construction update: Lake to Lake Trail temporary closure begins Friday, June 1**

In order to protect the community and the environment, King County is rehabilitate sewer pipelines along a 2,400 foot-long section of the Eastgate Interceptor. The Eastgate Interceptor pipeline is a part of King County's regional wastewater system. Pipelines carry wastewater from homes and businesses to our regional treatment plants. This project will extent the useful life of this pipeline another 50 years.

King County's contractor for the Eastgate Interceptor Rehabilitation III project will need temporary closures of the Lake to Lake Trail in the Lake Hills Greenbelt Park as they prepare to rehabilitate the sewer pipe. Work continues on lining the sewer pipes that are underground. A wooden bridge over the pipe crossing the trail has been constructed for trail users.

### **What you can expect:**

- On Friday, 6/1, Saturday, 6/2, Monday, 6/4, and Tuesday, 6/5, at varying times through the day and night the contractor will be moving equipment by using the trail.
- The closures are planned for the entire day, but may not require the entire period.
- During this work, gardeners and visitors may experience sewer odors, and some odor when the lining is installed.

The lining work is expected to take 6-8 weeks to complete. Other project work continue after this, including manhole lining, site clean-up and restoration.
