Eastside Interceptor Project - update for the week of Oct. 31 – Nov. 6

The <u>Eastside Interceptor (ESI)</u> is one of the main sewer lines that brings wastewater from eastside homes and business to the South Treatment Plant in Renton. This project is repairing about 3,700 feet of the line, which is corroded and nearing the end of its service life (see <u>map</u> below).


For October 31 through November 6:

- Current and upcoming work: Lining work is now finished and the bypass sewage flows have been returned to the Eastside Interceptor pipe. Ongoing work for this project includes:
 - o Manhole lining at different locations, many along Logan Avenue
 - Taking apart and removing the bypass pipe
 - o Removing the temporary work areas, including at Burnett Avenue North & North 6th Street
 - o Restoration, sidewalk and street repair
- A temporary lane closure and traffic control along Logan Ave. continue this week. This is to allow crews access to manholes in the street and to remove the bypass pipe.
- Work hours: Most of the work is being done during days, Monday-Saturday, with some night work.
- Odor control is being utilized for the project:
 - Ventalation and odor control equipment will need to be running at the corner of Burnett Ave. North and North 6th Street for one day next week.
 - There are no longer any odors associated with operation of the temporary bypass system; however there may be slight and temporary odors associated with work at the manholes, dismantling of the bypass pipe and restoring work areas back to their original condition.
- Barriers along Logan Avenue: This is an active construction area do not touch or cross the barriers or walk through the work area. Please cross the street to find safe areas to walk.
- The bike lane along Logan Avenue between Park Avenue and North 6th Street is closed due to construction. Please cross over to the east side of Logan Avenue or take an alternate route.
- The work area at Burnett Avenue and North 6th Street: over the next few weeks expect activity here, as the work area is being dismantled and removed.
