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
Near Neighbor Surveys

Project Summary

- ➤ Interviews conducted Dec. 12 15, 2004
- \triangleright Magnolia Residents: n=100; M.O.E. = \pm 10 points
- \triangleright Magnolia Business: n=35; M.O.E. = \pm 17 points
- > Renton Residents: n=101; M.O.E. = ± 10 points
- > Renton Business: n=35; M.O.E = \pm 17 points
- ➤ **Note:** Some numbers reflect "n" size (the actual number of respondents/businesses), and others reflect percentages. Where appropriate, notes were added to denote whether a percentage or "n" was used.
- \triangleright M.O.E. = margin of error.

Awareness and Opinions


Are you aware of a wastewater treatment facility near your business/in you area? (Q5)



- Awareness of the treatment plant in Magnolia exceeds awareness in Renton.
 - As is the case in Magnolia, Renton residents show greater awareness than Renton businesses (Residents: 62% n=62; Businesses: 43% n=15)
 - Three-quarters (77%: n=27) of businesses and 84% (n=84) of residents in Magnolia are aware of the treatment plant.
 - Renton residents were included in this survey for the first time this year.

Awareness and Opinions

As you may know, King County's Department of Natural Resources and Parks, operates a wastewater treatment plant in Renton/Magnolia. Generally speaking, do you feel the treatment plant has been or has not been a good neighbor?



- In each of the populations surveyed, a majority of respondents feel the treatment plants have been a good neighbor.
 - The most notable difference found this year is in the number of Magnolia businesses that answered "Don't know" since last year (n=10 in 2004; n=1 in 2003; n=6 in 2002). However, because of the small sample size of this subgroup, statistical tests are unreliable, and it cannot be concluded the difference is statistically significant.



- ➤ The most common reason Magnolia residents say King County has been a good neighbor continues to be the lack of any noticeable impacts ("unobtrusive/minimal effects" n=23).
 - This has been the top reason since the baseline survey in 2002.

- Four out of five (n=80) residents say they experience no impacts.
 - ➤ One out of five (n=20)

 Magnolia residents say they experience some impacts that could be the result of the wastewater facility.
 - This number is statistically identical to the baseline measure established in 2003.



- As with residents, and consistent with the past two surveys, the top response Magnolia businesses give for why KC has been a good neighbor is the lack of any noticeable impacts (n=7).
 - If items 4 and 5 in the chart ("truck traffic" and "no smell") are considered "no troubles/ unobtrusive," this would bring the total to n=10.

- ➤ More than four out of five (n=29) businesses say they do not experience any noticeable impacts.
 - ➤ Six (n=6) of the Magnolia businesses say they experience some impacts that could be the result of the wastewater facility.
 - These results are statistically identical to last year's benchmark measure.



- The benchmark measurement for Renton residents is similar to residents in Magnolia, although fewer residents in Renton are aware of the plant, and many were unable to give a rating.
 - ➤ Of those who said the county has been a good neighbor (n=55; 55%), most (n=13; 24%) say the county has been a good neighbor because of "no troubles/unobtrusive."

- ➤ Only one out of five (n=22) residents in Renton say they experienced negative impacts that could be the result of the wastewater facility.
 - ➤ 17 of the residents experienced a bad smell, 3 poor water quality, and 1 says poor drainage.



➤ 14 of 35 Renton businesses say no noticeable impact (12 "no trouble" and 2 "No smell") is the reason King County has been a good neighbor.

- The number of businesses in Renton that say they don't experience any impacts has not changed statistically since last year.
 - ➤ Only four Renton businesses say they experience some impacts that could be the result of the wastewater facility.
 - ➤ 3 of those businesses experience a bad smell, which is identical to last year's results.

- The top two priorities for King

 responding to complaints within
 24 hours and exploring new
 methods of odor control.
 - The lowest priority for King County is offering plant tours to the community.
 - The ranking of priorities has changed very little during the past three years.

- During the past three years, responding to complaints within 24 hours and exploring new methods of odor control have been the top priorities among Magnolia businesses.
 - In contrast, the lowest priority for King County among Magnolia businesses during the past three years has been offering plant tours to the community.

- This year's (2004) survey is the first measure of priorities for Renton residents.
 - Exploring new methods of odor control and responding to complaints within 24 hours are the top two priorities for residents surrounding the South plant.
 - Reducing truck trips and offering plant tours to residents are the lowest priorities among those tested in the survey.

- As in the previous years' surveys, the top priorities among Renton businesses are exploring new methods of odor control and responding to questions, concerns, or complaints within 24 hours.
 - ➤ Improving the landscaping, however, jumped in priority from No. 5 in 2003 to No. 3 in this year's survey.

- The top response for what King County can do to be a better neighbor in 2004 is "nothing" (n=41).
 - Among those who gave a specific suggestion, reducing the smell/odor (n=12), providing more public information (n=11) and controlling traffic (n=10) are the most popular.

- As with the residents, the top response from Magnolia businesses for what King County can do to be a better neighbor is "nothing" (n=17).
 - One item that was mentioned by four (n=4) businesses is to "control traffic." This item was not mentioned last year.
 - An additional four businesses say "respond to complaints."

- Among the items that include real suggestions from Renton residents, "controlling the odor" (n=19) is by far the most frequent.
- Renton residents surveyed for the first time in 2004.

➤ Similar to last year, though in reverse order, the most frequent substantive suggestions made by Renton businesses are to provide "more public information" (n=6) and "eliminate/control the odor" (n=4).

Summary of Findings

- ➤ Opinions about the wastewater facility and its priorities have shown little, if any, movement during the past three years.
- In all four surveys, a strong majority of respondents say the King County wastewater treatment facility has been a good neighbor.
- Residents and businesses in Renton are less aware of the wastewater treatment facility than those in Magnolia.
- The highest priorities for all four populations is to respond to citizens' complaints, questions, or concerns within 24 hours and to explore new methods of odor control.
- Aside from controlling odor, providing more public information was the most common suggestion for what King County can do to be a better neighbor.
