



King County crews continue pipe repair on Lake Hills Boulevard in Bellevue- sidewalk restoration Monday, November 6

King County's contractor has identified a section of the pipeline needing repair. The County's contractor will replace the section of pipe, backfill the excavation, and restore the sidewalk. In addition, the pipeline is almost completely blocked with fat and debris. The pipe will be cleaned at a later time.

We expect the pipe repair work to be completed this week but sidewalk restoration will continue through Monday, November 6. The sidewalk will remain closed in the work area over the weekend. The bike lane will not be affected.

Background

On Sunday, Oct. 22, King County crews responded to a sewer overflow in Bellevue. The overflow was located on Lake Hills Boulevard near 156th Avenue Southeast. Crews transferred wastewater flows to a second pipeline and completed cleanup and inspection.

What you can expect:

- Work hours are 9:00 a.m.-3:30 p.m.
- A section of the sidewalk adjacent to Lake Hills Boulevard will be closed between 155th Avenue Southeast and 156th Avenue Southeast over the weekend.
- Watch for flaggers and follow directions and signs as you travel through the area Monday.
- The bicycle lane will not be affected over the weekend.
