

You then have the option of making another choice by completely filling in another oval.

### Optional write-in



To add a new candidate, fill in the oval next to the write-in line and pri the name on the write-in line.

Always look at both sides of your ballot.

Do not cut, tear or damage the ballot.

If approved, this proposition would replace an expiring levy to fund: housing for low-income seniors, workers, and households, and the disabled and mentally ill; and homelessness prevention and reduction programs, including emergency rental assistance for atrisk families.  It authorizes regular property taxes above RCW 84.55 limits, allowing \$290,000,000 in additional taxes over seven years beginning in 2017, limited to \$41,428,571/year.
