# April 23, 2019, special election Voter registration and election information





### Requirements

To register to vote in Washington, you must be:

- · A citizen of the United States;
- · A legal resident of Washington State;
- · At least 18 years old by Election Day;
- Not under the Department of Corrections supervision for a Washington felony conviction; and
- Not disqualified from voting due to a court order.

#### How to register

- Register online with the Secretary of State, www.vote.wa.gov.
- Download a registration form from the King County Elections website and return it by mail.
- Register in person at the King County Elections office or Elections Annex.

#### Registration deadlines

While you may register to vote at any time, there are registration deadlines prior to each election. The deadlines for the April 23, 2019, special election are:

- Mar. 25 Deadline to register to vote online or by mail, or update existing voter registration information.
- Apr. 15 In-person registration deadline for people not currently registered in Washington.
   Register in person at the King County Elections office or at the Elections Annex.

#### Keep your voter registration current

Update your registration if you have moved or changed your name, or if your signature has changed. Simply update your information online or submit a new registration form.
