Register to vote

Who can register

To register to vote in Washington, you must be:

- · A citizen of the United States;
- A legal resident of Washington State;
- · At least 18 years old by Election Day;
- · Not disqualified from voting due to a court order; and
- Not under Department of Corrections supervision for a Washington State felony conviction.

How to register

Online

You can register online at www.vote.wa.gov – you'll need a Washington State Driver License or ID. Make sure you register online by the October 28 deadline for the General Election.

By mail

Download and print a registration form from www.kingcounty.gov/elections and mail it to our office by the October 28 deadline for the General Election.

In person

You can register in person through November 5, Election Day at the King County Elections office, Elections Annex or one of the vote centers listed on the King County Elections website.

Keep your voter registration current

Update your registration if you have moved or changed your name, or if your signature has changed. Simply update your information online or submit a new registration form by October 28 for the General Election or visit us in person through November 5, Election Day at one of the vote centers listed on the King County Elections website.

Ballot information

On Tuesday, November 5, 2019, in King County, Washington, there will be held a general and special election conducted entirely by mail.

Replacement ballot

Call King County Elections to obtain a replacement ballot if your original ballot packet is lost, spoiled or destroyed.
