Voter registration information

Requirements

To register to vote in Washington, you must be:

- · A citizen of the United States
- A legal resident of Washington state
- At least 18 years old by election day
- If you are 16 or 17, you can sign up as a Future Voter and be automatically registered to vote when you qualify
- Not disqualified from voting due to a court order
- Not currently serving a sentence of total confinement under the jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections for a Washington felony conviction
- Not currently incarcerated for a federal or out-of-state felony conviction

How to register

Online

You can register or update your registration online at VoteWA.gov — you'll need a Washington State Driver License or ID. Make sure you register online by the July 24 deadline for the August 1 Primary and Special Election.

By mail

Download and print a registration form from kce.wiki/VoterReg to register or update your registration and mail it to our office by the July 24 deadline for the August 1 Primary and Special Election.

In person

You can register in person through August 1, Election Day, at a vote center. For more information on locations and hours of vote centers, visit www.kingcounty.gov/elections.

Keep your voter registration current

Update your registration if you have moved or changed your name, or if your signature has changed. Simply update your information online or submit a new registration form by July 24 for the Primary and Special Election or visit us in person through August 1, Election Day, at one of the vote centers listed on the King County Elections website.

Ballot information

On Tuesday, August 1, 2023 in King County, Washington, there will be held a Primary and Special Election conducted entirely by mail.

Replacement ballot

Call King County Elections to obtain a replacement ballot if your original ballot packet is lost, spoiled, or destroyed.
