

What we know about sexual assault:

Prevalent

- 1 in 3 girls and 1 in 6 boys experience sexual abuse during childhood
- 23% of women in Washington State reported being a victim of rape at some point in their lifetime

Under Reported

- 60% of sexual assaults go unreported to law enforcement

Offender is Known By Victim

- 53% Family Member
- 36% Acquaintance
- 11% Stranger

What can we do?

- We can't stop what we can't talk about.
- Sexual assault is preventable – by Being Loud, we can change information, beliefs, and behaviors regarding sexual assault.

- Businesses and corporations

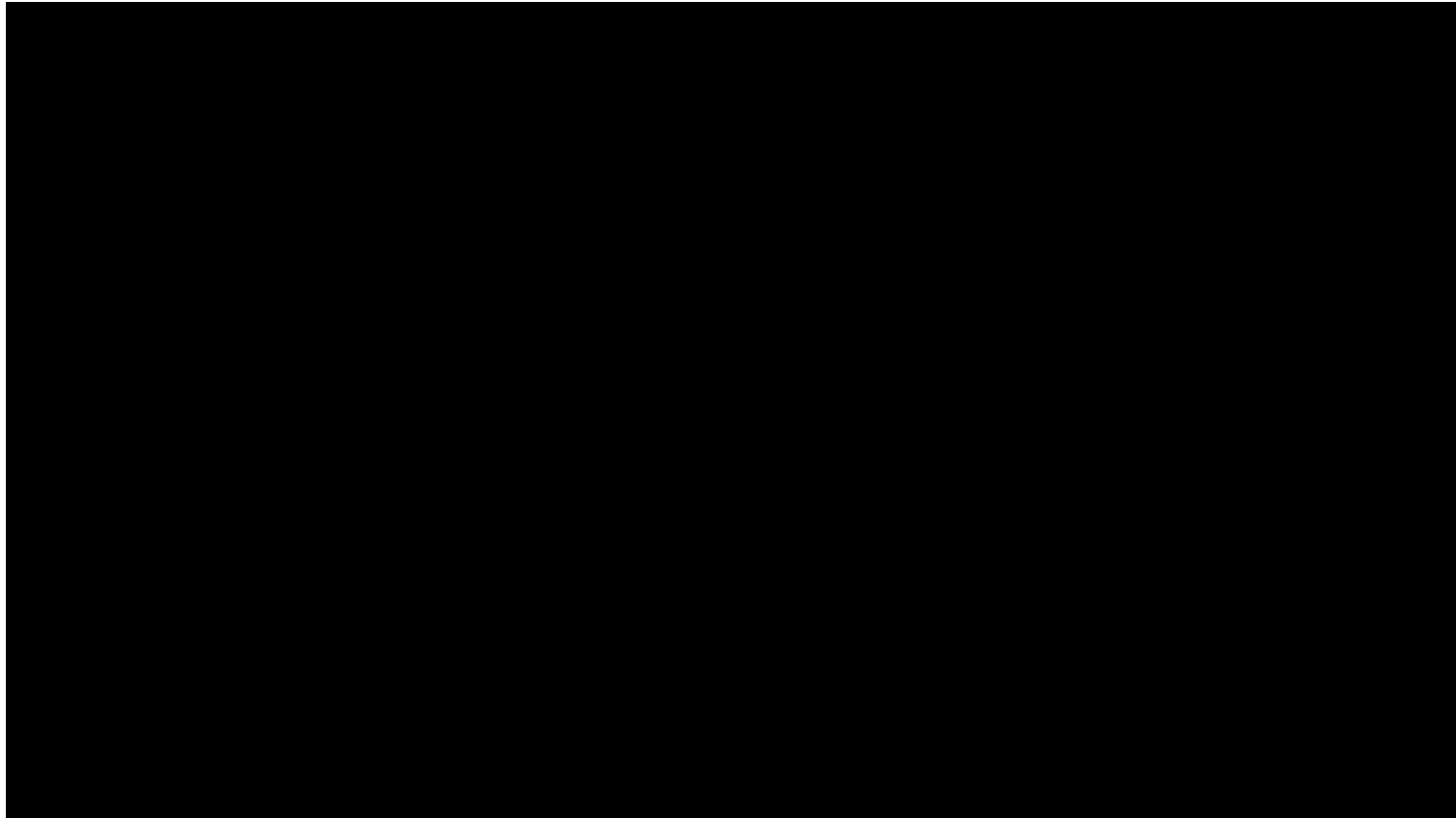

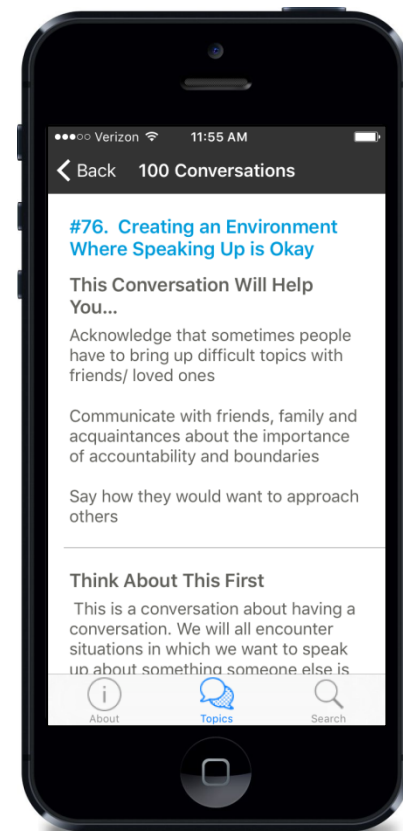
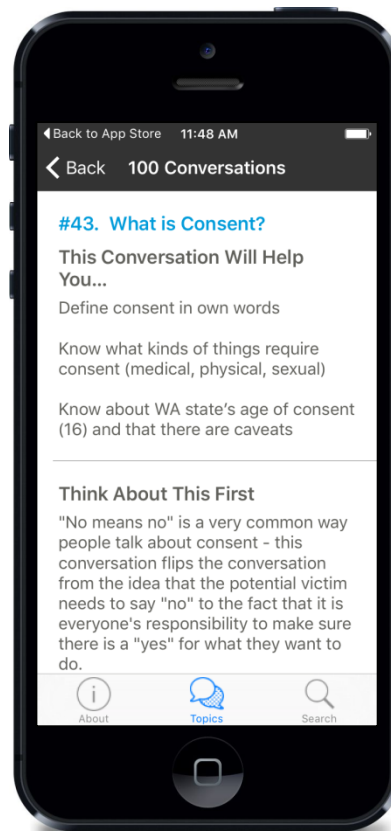
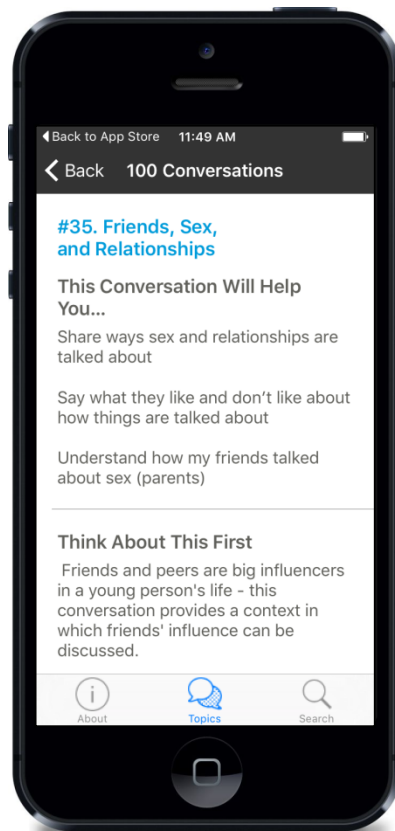
Three things your city can do to **BE LOUD**:
