

 - Urban Centers, Mfg-Industrial Centers
 - Urban Growth Area
 - High Capacity Transit
 - Housing & job growth targets, each jurisdiction
- City and county Comprehensive Plans
- **Regulations**, zoning and capital improvements

Urban Centers Process

- First round: 12 Urban Centers designated
- Over years 1994 2015, six additional centers designated
- King Co CPPs center designation criteria
 - High standards of size, density and future intent
- Once named in CPPs, can be nominated as Regional Growth Centers in VISION

In context of Central Puget Sound Regional Growth Centers and Mfg-Industrial Centers

King County GMA Progress

- Before we discuss Centers results, GMA is an overall success story in King County
- Increasing focus of growth into UGA: 98% of housing growth
- Protection of resource & rural areas
- Growth shifting from edges to city centers
- Increase in high-capacity transit capacity, and ridership

Increasing Center Success

• Between 2000 and 2014:

- Urban Centers gained 48,500 people
- 10 centers gained 39,000 jobs, but 8 lost jobs
- Housing / population growth in Centers
- Seattle: CBD, S. Lk. Union, Cap. Hill, U Dist
- Bellevue CBD, Redmond CBD, Overlake
- Renton, SeaTac
- Other centers not sharing in growth yet, but ST3 will connect them
