ORDER OF REMAND

SUBJECT: Department of Permitting and Environmental Review file no. LUT4170003 Proposed ordinance no.: 2018-0295

KCC 21A.55.105.X provides that an interim use permit <u>shall</u> include an approved site plan addressing the items enumerated in KCC 21A.55.105.X.1; an approved grading plan in compliance with chapter 16.82 KCC; an approved drainage plan in compliance with the Surface Water Design Manual, and a restoration plan complying with KCC 21A.55.105.X.4. DPER has not approved a site plan, grading plan, drainage plan, or restoration plan. The Hearing Examiner cannot render a decision on the interim use permit without these required plans. However, as discussed at the August 16, 2018 hearing, the requirement for an approved drainage plan is somewhat problematic. The drainage plan will depend on the final grades established following excavation, assuming that the interim use permit is ultimately approved. Consequently, the drainage plan required for the Hearing Examiner to be able to render a decision on the interim use permit must address those aspects of the Surface Water Design Manual that apply to the excavation. The Interim Use Permit, if ultimately approved, will require a drainage plan for the final elevations and proposed uses.

DPER has recommended that the interim use permit be conditioned upon the preparation of a Sound Control Plan. *See*, Exhibit 2, recommended Condition 5. As discussed at the August 16 hearing, the Hearing Examiner has concluded that it is inappropriate to defer preparation of the Sound Control Plan.

Pursuant to Hearing Examiner Rules of Procedure and Mediation (HER) XV.C, LUT4170003 is **REMANDED** to DPER to:

- 1. Require and approve:
 - A. A site plan addressing the items enumerated in KCC 21A.55.105.X.1;
 - B. A Drainage Plan addressing those aspects of the Surface Water Manual that apply to the proposed excavation;
 - C. A restoration plan complying with KCC 21A.55.105.X.4; and
 - D. A Sound Control Plan.
- 2. Require and be ready to approve:

A grading plan in compliance with chapter 16.82 KCC. The Hearing Examiner uses the phrase "be ready to approve" to acknowledge that approval of a grading permit typically requires the posting of a bond and that it is inappropriate to require a bond at this stage in the process.

Following DPER's review and action on these plans, the Hearing Examiner will reopen the hearing in this matter.

In making its recommendation, DPER applied the Special Use Permit criteria found in KCC 21A.44.050. The Applicant contends that these criteria do not apply. DPER, the Applicant, and Soos Creek Area Response may submit a brief to the Hearing Examiner addressing the appropriate criteria for review of the interim use permit **one week prior to the date of the reopened hearing**.
