- Meeting monthly since July 2017
- Working towards recommending a regional affordable housing strategy to be finalized by December 2018

Estimated 156,000 new homes needed to meet need today
Estimated 244,000 new homes needed by 2040 to meet projected population

 - *Land use changes, such as accessory dwelling units
 - Sub-regional coordination
 - Preserving existing affordable homes
 - Incentive zoning
