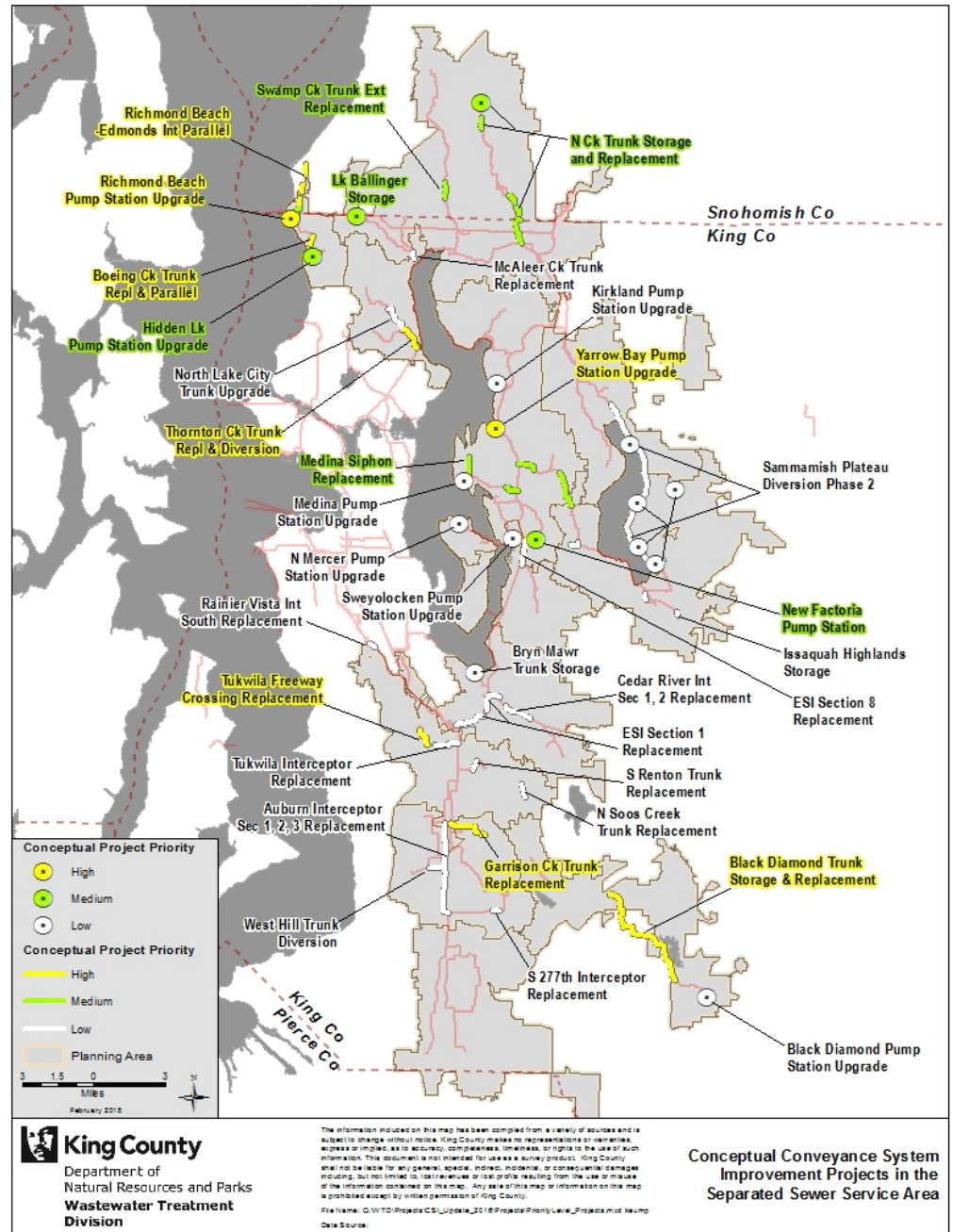
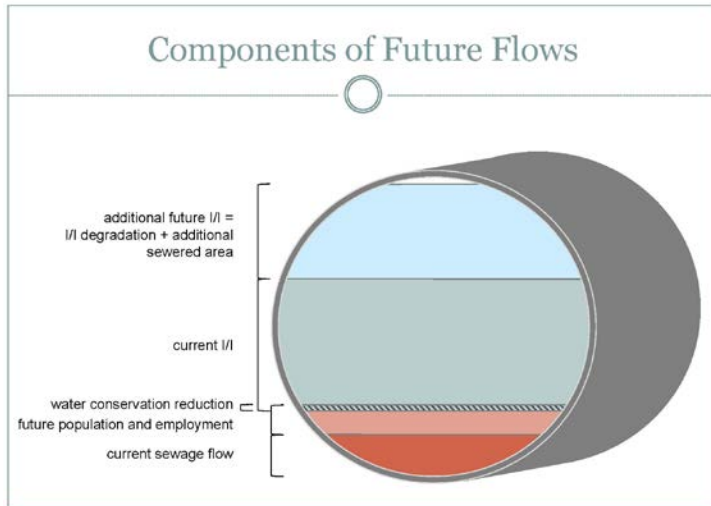

I/I in the regional wastewater system

- Approximately 70% of peak flow is I/I
- 50-70% I/I is from private side sewers
- Approximately \$1.7 billion (2016\$) in CSI Projects through 2060



Regional I/I Program History

- 1999 – Program created as part of RSWP.
- 2001-2002 – Current levels of I/I defined for each local agency.
- 2003-2004 – 10 pilot projects in 12 local agency jurisdictions to demonstrate the effectiveness of collection system rehabilitation projects, test technologies, and gain cost information.
- 2004 – Final draft model standards, procedures, policies, and guidelines developed for use by local agencies to reduce I/I in there systems.
- 2005 – Thorough benefit-cost analysis completed to determine the cost effectiveness of I/I reduction.
- 2007 – 2009 – Selection of initial I/I project areas
- 2011 – 2013 – Initial I/I reduction project in Skyway Water and Sewer District constructed
- 2015 – MWPAAC I/I Task Force
- 2016 to present evaluation of I/I reduction concepts

Program Options (Table 1 of Handout)

- Approach to Common Side Sewer Standards
 - Regional BMP sharing for voluntary use
 - Focused standardization and voluntary implementation
 - Scalable BMP program
- Standard Regional Inspection Training
 - Training modules online for voluntary use
 - Training modules + videos, hands-on sessions for voluntary use
 - Training certification
- Regional I/I Support
 - Resource sharing between agencies
 - County provided resources
 - County provided resources and vendors
- Regional Side Sewer Inspection Program
 - Point of Sale
 - General
- Side Sewer Grant/Loan Program
 - independent vs. In tandem with other program

Potential Program Frameworks

- Purpose: Provide enough detail on potential program to inform evaluation and a decision on whether to proceed with studying implementation.
- Contents:
 - Description and case studies
 - Program benefits/risks
 - Legal authorities that may be required
 - New procedures that may be required
 - Potential cost implications
 - Potential incentives/penalties
 - Partners for implementation
 - Potential funding
 - Methods for assessing effectiveness

- Effectiveness
- Legal implications
- Property owner impacts
- Local agency impacts
- WTD impacts
- Equity and social justice

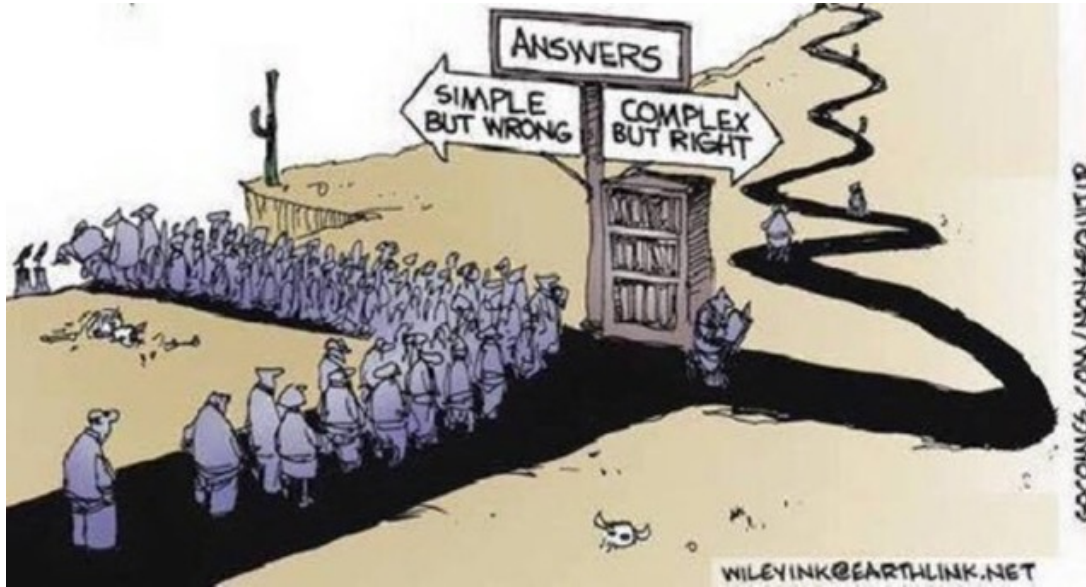
