Draft Program Framework Options

Approach to Common Side Sewer Standards

- Regional BMP sharing for voluntary use
- Focused standardization and voluntary implementation
- Scalable BMP program

Standard Regional Inspection Training

- Training modules online for voluntary use
- Training modules + videos, hands-on sessions for voluntary use
- Training plus certification

Regional I/I Support

- Resource sharing between agencies
- County provided resources
- County provided resources and vendors

Regional Side Sewer Inspection Program

- Point of Sale
- General

Side Sewer Grant/Loan Program

- Independent of inspection program
- In tandem with inspection program

- Legal authorities that may be required
- New procedures that may be required
- Potential cost implications
- Potential incentives/penalties
- Partners for implementation
- Potential funding
- Methods for assessing effectiveness



Framework Test Case (Table 2 of Handout) – Framework for Point of Sale Private Side Sewer Inspection Program

- Is the description of the program adequate?
- Is the level of detail of the assumptions and features enough to aid in the comparison process?
- Are there other categories for consideration that you would like to see?

Draft Evaluation Criteria

(Table 3 of Handout)

Developed six criteria to rate and compare programs:

- Effectiveness
- Legal implications
- Property owner impacts
- Local agency impacts
- WTD impacts
- Equity and social justice



Draft Evaluation Criteria (Table 3 of Handout)

- Are the measurement and rating definitions in sufficient detail for assessing I/I program options?
- Are there additional criteria and/or sub-criteria that should be included for consideration?
- For Effectiveness criteria: Should this be split between Regional and Local?
- For Impacts: Should "impact" be changed to "involvement level" – both cost and actions? Or other term?

Evaluation Criteria Test Case (Table 4 of Handout) Point of Sale Private Side Sewer Inspection Program Rating

- Are the rationales for ratings (column 3) in enough detail to support the rating?
- Do the rationale or ratings raise any questions about criteria measures?
